
"The World Needs Who You Were Made to Be" by Joanna Gaines

Read Aloud Tips:

- Introduce the book by flipping through the pages and showing the students the illustrations. The students can predict what the book is about.
- Have students create their own hot-air balloon. Within the balloon, students can write their favorite qualities about themselves as well as goals or aspirations.
- Ask student why they think it is important to celebrate our differences. This can be tied back to the overall meaning and theme of the book.
