Sessions will take place Monday-Friday and the schedule is as follows:

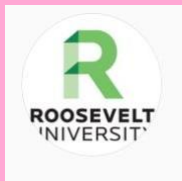

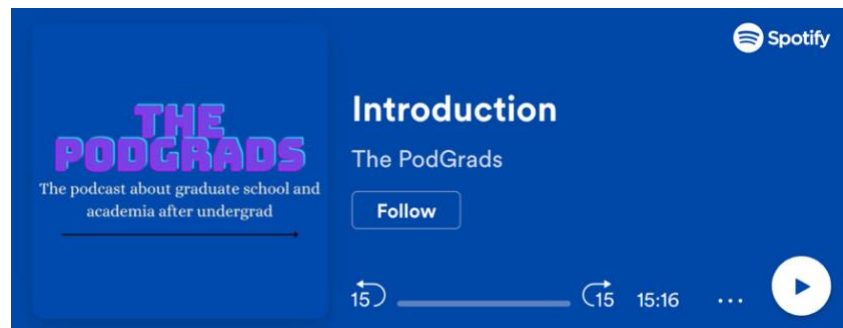
Here are a few of interest with deadlines in [March](#):

Recipients can use their Gilman Scholarship funds to pay for credit-bearing virtual study abroad or international internship programs.
  - *Discipline*: STEM, Education
  - *Deadline*: March 9<sup>th</sup>
- [National Institutes of Health \(NIH\) Undergraduate Scholarship Program](#): A 10-week Summer Laboratory Experience as a paid summer research employee in an NIH research laboratory.
  - *Discipline*: Biomedical Sciences, Health Sciences, Social Sciences
  - *Deadline*: March 17<sup>th</sup>
- [RAY Diversity Fellowship](#): A two-year paid fellowship designed to equip recent college graduates with the tools, experiences, support, and community they need to become leaders in the conservation and clean energy sectors.
